Texas Partnership for Out of School Time (TXPOST) - OST CARES



Texas Partnership for Out of School Time (TXPOST) launched OST CARES to enhance mental health support and awareness in Texas out-of-school time (OST). Supported by funding authorized by the 88th Texas Legislature, OST CARES aims to address the increasing need for mental health support across our state by recognizing the power of OST programs to implement promotion and prevention strategies to support the well-being of kids and families better.

Direct service OST providers selected to participate in OST CARES will receive comprehensive staff training, ongoing support through a community of practice, and a participation stipend to implement mental health awareness and intervention activities with youth in their programs.

Community-based, nonprofit organizations interested in participating in the third OST CARES cohort are invited to visit the OST CARES webpage to review the program guidelines and complete the interest survey by January 31, 2025.

Interested organizations may also attend TXPOST's virtual office hours to ask any questions about the program and receive additional guidance.

The New York Life Foundation's 2024 Aim High grant competition is now open for applications! Forty grants totaling \$1.8 million will be awarded to afterschool, summer, or expanded learning programs serving middle school youth.

Programs will be selected for grants based on their ability to help youth transition successfully to ninth grade and how they provide academic, social, and emotional support for youth.

Eligible programs can apply to one of four grant categories with funding ranging from \$15,000 to \$100,000.

In the Fall of 2023, the U.S. Department of Education and the five partnering organizations designed the Engage Every Student Recognition Program, which aims to recognize (1) non-profit organizations working in collaboration with school district/local education agencies (LEAs), (2) city municipalities or local government entities, and (3) LEAs working in collaboration with non-profit organization or city municipalities that engage K-12 students in high-quality afterschool or summer learning programming.
